The Parent-Teacher Conferences (PTCs) for all the classes have been extremely well attended and we have been overwhelmed with the positive feedback we have received. We have been informed that these conferences have provided parents with specific information on how they can support their children in school and outside of class.

The accomplishments of our students in various spheres of school activity are authentic examples of NPS' dedication to the development of each and every student's potential in a positive environment. It brings me great pleasure to inform you of this year's most significant accomplishments.

#### Student Achievements 2022-23

Like in the previous years, our students left their mark on every competition or event they participated. The following are some of the most admirable academic and extracurricular accomplishments:

- 1. Students from National Public School, Rajajinagar once again brought honour to their school and their loved ones with their outstanding academic performance in the 2021–2022 board exams (Grades 10 and 12).
  - o From Grade 10 our school toppers are Anika U Bhat (99.40%), Aditya Sridhar (98.80%) and Anisha R (98.60%).
  - From Grade 12, our school toppers are Aryan Jha and Gayatri K (98.6%), Dyuthi Vivek (98%), Rohan J S and Shreya L N (97.85) from the Science stream and Akash G C (97.2%), Natasha Maria Gonsalves (96%) and Malini Subash (95.6%) from the Commerce stream.

- 2. Susmit Roy of Grade 12 achieved an All-India Rank of 64 and was awarded the prestigious KVPY Scholarship under the aegis of the Indian Institute of Science, Bangalore.
- 3. Sambarta Sanyal, Rishav Sanjay, Abhiram Sagiraju and Pratham G Bhat of Grade 10 were selected for Round 2 of the IIT Gandhinagar Aptitude test, BrainWiz. Sambarta Sanyal and Rishav Sanjay secured the first and eighth position out of the 100 students.
- 4. IIT Guwahati had organised Technothlon, an International School Science based Championship for students of Grades 9 to 12. Sambarta Sanyal of Grade 10 was one of the 50 toppers and a gold medallist. He was also invited to IIT Guwahati during Techniche where he battled it out in various exciting events like Robotics, Aeromodelling and Brainstorming analysis.
- 5. Indian Institute of Science, Bangalore conducted their annual fest Pravega a Scientific Extravaganza. Susmit Roy and Rohann Rahul Shah of Grade 12 stood 1st and 3rd in the Biology based competition, 'What would Darwin Do?'
- 6. Aryabhatta Ganit Challenge Dhivith Vivek of Grade 9 was placed in the top 100 students from Bengaluru region of CBSE at the All-India level of the CBSE Ganit Challenge.
- 7. Scholastic Writers Academy identifies and nurtures talented writers from across the country. A 10-day mentorship program, under the able guidance of Literary Experts, helps writers hone their skills, provides them with a reader's perspective and moulds them into becoming published authors. The following students are now published authors with Scholastic, under the Writers Academy Program. Anika U Bhat's (Grade 11) story was published in 'A Library of Nineteen', a splendid anthology of 19 stories. 'Rainbow Between the Covers', an anthology of 18 stories contains stories by the young authors Anmol Saroop Grade 6), Shreya Kanjur (Grade 7), Samanvitha Prasad (Grade 7), Anaghashree Nair (Grade 8), Niharika Shukla (Grade 8) and Aagna Ajith Ambale (Grade 8).
- 8. Swara Vinay (KG 1A) secured 1<sup>st</sup> place and Vihaan Majjagi (KG 2A) secured 25<sup>th</sup> place at the National Level for their talks on Freedom Fighters conducted by The Central Heritage Department, India.
- 9. Smayan Aditya Baliga (KG 2A) secured a medal for Inter State Tae-kwon-do competition.
- 10. Logiquids, Olympiad, an IIT-IIM venture, was organised for the Senior Kindergarten. Laksh Karegoud and Sanchi Jain stood 2<sup>nd</sup> at the International Level.
- 11. Divit Bhargava, Grade 4 has hit the bull's eye in Kaun Banega Crorepati 2021-22 held in Mumbai. He was awarded a cash voucher of Rupees 3 Lakh 20 thousand and a gift hamper from Britania.
- 12. Krupha S Ukkali, Grade 5 stood at Rank 6 in the U-10 and Rank 22 in the U-12 girls Chess Championship 2022, conducted by the All-India Chess Federation.
- 13. Dheemanth Mahesh of Grade 8 won gold and silver medals for Roller-skating at various State and National level Roller-skating Championships.
- 14. Aditya S of Grade 7 has been selected for the National level Inline hockey tournament.

- 15. NPS Rajajinagar Under 13 girls were selected for the National level Basketball tournament held in Himachal Pradesh. Hanisha S Shinde and Anvita Sanner of Grade 8 created history by taking home the gold medal.
- 16. The Basketball under 13 National camp at Bangalore was attended by Tanmay Manish Dhoke of Grade 9.
- 17. Khushi N (Grade 10), Tisha V (Grade 10) and Parth K Dubbal (Grade 11) were part of the Bronze medal winning girls and boys teams respectively at the Under 16 National level basketball tournament held in Madhya Pradesh.
- 18. Priyaka B (Grade 12), Khushi N (Grade 10) and Avinash Nayak (Grade 12) were part of the Bronze medal winning girls and boys teams respectively at the Under 18 National level basketball tournament held in Calicut.
- 19. At the Junior NBA National level basketball championships held in Noida, Sameeha R Rai (Grade 9), Tisha V (Grade 10) and Divaa Utkarsha (Grade 9) were members of the winning team and emerged as champions. Tisha V and Sameeha R Rai also attended the Junior NBA Indian camp.
- 20. Priyanka B (Grade 12), Khushi N (Grade 10) and Avinash Nayak (Grade 12) were part of the Karnataka state team that participated in the Khelo India National level basketball tournament at Indore, Madhya Pradesh.
- 21. Siddhi Gautam Shah (Grade 10) won the silver medal for the 50m backstroke at the 48th Junior National Aquatic swimming championships 2022 held at Odisha. In the 50 m backstroke at the Khelo India Youth Games held at Bhopal she secured the 5th position. In the 100m backstroke of the Khelo India women's league Zone 3 held at Bangalore, she bagged the 2<sup>nd</sup> place. Siddhi also won silver and gold medals at the 50m and 100m backstroke respectively at the Karnataka State Mini Olympics held at Bangalore.
- 22. Dhruti Anand Deshpande (Grade 12) won the Silver medal for 200m freestyle, Gold for 100m Butterfly stroke and the Bronze medal for 50m Breast stroke at the CBSE Zonal Interschool swimming competition at Bangalore and was placed second at the CBSE National level competition held at Rajkot, Gujarat.

#### School Prefect and Best Outgoing Students 2022-23

Each year, 2 students from Class 12 receive the highest honour, which stands for leadership, bravery, and extreme diligence. the honour of being chosen as the school representatives and as the student prefects, who serve as the face of the present generation. For the academic year 2022-23, *Vishal S Rao and Aditi Prabhu of Grade 12* were elected as the student prefects.

Akash G C of Grade 12 was awarded the LT. Col. Ajit Bhandarkar Memorial Award for the best academic and co-curricular performance for the academic year 2021-22.

#### **Annual Fees**

Annual Fees for the academic year 2023-24 may please be remitted from 15.03.2023 to 05.04.2023 in the Academis parent portal. We presume that the students who do not remit the fees by the due date will not be continuing in the school for the next academic year.

An annual fee increase of 7.5% to 10% is effective to offset the increasing expenditure by way of salary, DA, HRA, maintenance and material expenditure etc. as NPS is a private self-financing institution.

We also have a new increase in the property tax of the school. We are sure our parents will understand the escalations.

School-parent communication fosters better understanding and collaboration to make education a wholesome experience for the child. We thank all parents for positively supporting the school for all the initiatives undertaken.
